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Principle Six: Willingness

Willingness is defined as our commitment to do whatever it takes to recover. Early on, I was told repeatedly that if I went to the same lengths to stay sober as I did to get drunk, then I would have no issues abstaining from alcohol. But abstinence alone is not enough; recovery requires the willingness to confront my most grievous faults and try every day to overcome them.

Steps Four and Five are both an information-gathering exercise and a way to rob our most secret fears and insecurities of their power over us. Step Six requires us to list our defects and confront them head-on. Without a healthy dose of willingness, we would balk at this task and leave the rooms for one reason or another. We watch it happen countless times.

But if someone gains the willingness to do the work necessary, then there is no way to predict where their sobriety will take them.

Meeting: Bright Spot


Day/Time: Monday - Saturday, 7:00 a.m.
